Overview

The VCU implementation of the Ithaka S+R Local Faculty Survey was launched on April 7, 2014, and was closed to new responses on April 25, 2014, with a total of 628 complete responses. The survey covers many scholarly research and teaching-related topics, overlapping with several iterations of the Ithaka S+R U.S. Faculty Survey. The questionnaire covers topics in several key areas, including: how scholars discover materials for research; their research dissemination practices; the ways faculty members' access content; faculty members' views of their students' research skills; their needs regarding data preservation and management; and the role of the library in supporting faculty members' needs. In addition, the survey included questions tailored for health scientists, including: the role of various types of clinical decision support tools and resources, pedagogical expectations in clinical teaching environments, and student-faculty research collaboration in a clinical or health sciences context. The following report provides a high-level overview of findings from the VCU faculty survey.

Details

All 3,676 VCU faculty members received an email invitation to participate in a survey about the impact of electronic technologies on their research and teaching. Three email reminders were sent before the close of the survey. In total, 912 respondents clicked the survey link (about 25% of those who received the email invitation), with 878 of those starting the survey (about 24%), and 628 of those respondents completing the survey, for an overall response rate of about 17%. Due to the survey flow and skip patterns, not all VCU faculty respondents received every question in the survey.

How to interpret the findings

For each question in the VCU faculty survey, this document provides a graph and table of overall responses. Responses are generally grouped together into categories for questions where respondents are asked to respond on a 1 to 10 scale. We report on responses in three categories: 1-3 (strong negative response), 4-7 (moderate or indifferent response), and 8-10 (strong positive response). Questions that use a 1-6 scale, and their responses are similarly grouped into categories: 1-2 (strong negative response), 3-4 (moderate or indifferent response), and 5-6 (strong positive response). Title pages provide information about survey flow and contingent items, which signify that a question was only presented to those who satisfied a condition in their response to another question.













































Expectations regarding upper division students' research skills

















Faculty member's views and expectations regarding health science students' research skills



How valuable do you find each of the following possible sources of instructional support for your clinical or health science courses?






